



**Memorandum of Understanding  
Between  
International Society for Concrete Pavements, Inc.  
and  
Australian Society for Concrete Pavements Inc.**

The International Society for Concrete Pavements, Inc. (ISCP) and the Australian Society for Concrete Pavements Inc. (ASCP), hereafter referred to as 'the parties', desiring to strengthen their relationship and provide mutual support in their missions related to facilitating the advancement of knowledge and technology related to concrete pavements through education, technology transfer and research, enter into this Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) effective 17<sup>th</sup> August 2009.

The purpose of this MoU between ISCP and ASCP is to encourage collaboration and cooperation between the parties, and to avoid technical duplication wherever and whenever possible.

Neither party may use the other's name in a way that would imply endorsement of its technical reports or publications unless that publication has been reviewed and approved in writing for use as a joint publication.

The parties agree to formally review this MoU from time to time to ensure that it meets its stated goals.

This MoU shall remain in effect until such time as one or the other party requests its termination, normally giving six months written notice in order to hold discussions about termination and as a courtesy.

**Cooperative Efforts**

The parties agree to the following cooperative efforts in order to meet the stated purpose of this MoU.

1. Visits by each party's officers, staff or members to the other party's headquarters are encouraged.
2. Each party's members may register for the other's events (conventions, symposia, forums, seminars and the like) at member rates.
3. The parties will explore how best to provide each other's members with member-level access to the others web site.



4. Each party will have the right to promote this MoU on its website, letterhead and other materials.
5. Each party will, to the best of its abilities at the time, provide support for the other party's activities and programs when requested, including publicizing those activities and programs on its web site.
6. The parties may nominate a representative to join each other's relevant technical committees.
7. The parties will provide complimentary copies of their periodicals, and will provide their electronic newsletters, to each other's Executive Officer/Secretary. Information from the electronic newsletters may be conveyed to the other party's members upon written agreement.
8. The parties agree to conduct joint seminars/symposia/workshops from time to time. Such events, and any specific terms and conditions, are to be agreed upon specifically for each event.
9. When technical assistance is requested by one party, the other party will make its best effort to provide assistance by discussing the issue with its members (i.e., industry specialists and stakeholders) and by providing a formal response or contact name for the first party to discuss the issue with in more detail and to seek possible resolution.
