Call to Order and Introductions (Jeff Roesler)

- President Roesler welcomed the board members and called the meeting to order at 5:41 pm • (local time). Introductions ensued.

- o Reviewed budget (Appendix B)
 - 2016 expenses less than proposed (\$16.8k vs. 20k)
 - Mike Darter asked if FHWA contributed to conference; Leif Wathne verified they sponsored a few workshops, but did not contribute as significantly as has been done in the past (2009 and before).
 - Proposing webinars for next year added potential income.
 - Projected 2017 expenses are \$24k with projected net income of \$17k
 - Mark Snyder asked if there a plan to spend the net income rather than accumulating? Perhaps more international activities?
 - Roesler rediscuss executive director option in the future.
 - Mike Darter what were benefits of Rob's position as executive director.
 - Roesler –set up website, promotion, etc.
 - Mark Snyder brought up the idea of EUPAVE/ISCP joint webinars.
 - Roesler suggest that expenses/revenue related to webinars be added to budget
 - 0 Jake Hiller concurred.
 - Leif Wathne How are we going to increase individual membership proposed income when it is an increase over 2016 individual membership.
 - Roesler webinars are intended to generated income via memberships
 - Leif Wathne what are chances of organizational sponsors returning? Many originally joined for purposes of conference sponsorship. One of hooks for sponsorship is specialized webinars.
 - Roesler be careful that webinar series aren't all "sold"
 - Budget to be approved at next board meeting in February

Standing Committee Reports

11th International Conference (Leif Wathne/Corey Zollinger)

- Leif Wathne about 400 attendees at conference, great workshops, good sponsors. Leif working on report and list of major lessons learned. ISCP can't rely on major federal sponsors anymore. Eleven sponsored workshops (5k/each) were key to financial success. Budget key, bird-dogging costs, food/beverage were biggest financial exposure. Need to have discussion about hosting at hotel/convention or at university and everyone on their own for lodging. Hosting with NCC was big factor, especially for sponsors.
- Jake Hiller not including organizational sponsorships, 64k profit. Including sponsorships, 80k profit.



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• Mark Snyder noted that ISCP had about 430 attendees in Colorado (8th ICCP), San Antonio (11th ICCP) right behind that with approx. 400. San Francisco (9th ICCP) and Quebec City (10th ICCP) were closer to 300 attendees.

Membership Committee (Somayeh Nassiri)

• Committee chair was not present.

Nominating Committee (Neeraj Buch) – presentation of ballot for officers to be distributed after TRB

• Mark Snyder spoke on behalf of Neeraj Buchs Overview of ISCP nomination slate, constrained by by-laws regarding maximum number of nominations per country. 7 new board members, 6 positions rotating out. Jake Hiller to email out ballot about 1 week after TRB. Need responses by 1 February to install new director to four-year terms.

EUPAVE 2018 conference brought up by Bryan Perrie.

Old Business

ISCP/ACPA Webinar Series (Roesler)

- Still need to finalize few details with ACPA. Using ACPA platform and ACPA to help advertise. Reviewed preliminary lineup of webinar topics. Proposed minimum of 6 webinars in ISCP ACPA series. Trying to work out the number of free connections available for ISCP members; don't want to charge members for attending webinar.
- Mike Darter suggests CPR webinar as there is a large project in Missouri ... perhaps centered around best practices
- George Vorobieff suggested a joint webinar between ISCP/ASCP ASCP would present to ISCP audience. George will go back to cabinet to suggest topic for webinar.
- Separate four-part webinar in Spanish over two week period
 - o Juan Pablo Covarrubias to lead charge with registration
- EUPAVE wants overlay workshop
 - o Roesler asked for help with overlay webinar (Tom Burnham volunteer)
 - Mark Snyder mentioned Gary Ficke

12th International Conference Committee (Roesler)

- Jeff Roesler asked for volunteers for organizing committee/conference chair positions.
 - Leif Wathne willing to help but not be chair
 - o Several members have volunteered already, but always need more help.
- Potential locations were discussed for a summer 2020 timeframe in the United States
 - o Seattle suggested as potential location
 - o California does lots of concrete pavement and CALTRANS/CA-DOT.
 - Minneapolis does lots of urban stuff, overlays, MNRoad, Mall of America. Potentially good location.
 - o Florida building concrete test road near Gainesville, university setting as well.
 - Need to figure out driving factor determining attendance Attendees and sponsors



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- Concrete pavement construction numbers by state should be looked at as potential attendee generation.
- o Suggested to combine with NCC again.

New Business

New Honorary Member Elections (Buch)

• Nominations are open.

Mid-Year meeting (Pittsburgh, June 15-16, 2017)

• Good place to coincide with ACPA meeting. Afternoon of 15th and half day 16th. Local seminar would be good to arrange at that same time. More than half of board members say they can make it.

Review of ISCP Bylaws and membership benefits in 2017

- Is the Society happy with composition of board or do want to make adjustments to by-laws?
 - Bryan Perrie original intention was to keep society international however it is hard for international members to attend meetings.
- Need to take serious look at membership benefits.
 - Leif Wathne Can we reasonably expect sponsors to continue, especially if they sponsored for conference and aren't too interested in current membership benefits.
 - Corey Zollinger Likely that CEMEX will move to silver. Conference location will drive sponsorship level for next conference (Lorrie concurs).
 - Corey suggests that RCC pavement council charges flat fee of \$3k/yr to all members and has approx. 25 members and no troubles with getting/maintaining membership. Webinars and free individual memberships is driver for RCC pavement council members. Suggests raising number of organizational members rather than targeting individual members. Change branding of ISCP in the concrete pavement industry; need name recognition. CEMEX/Lorrie want to see more collaboration between ISCP and ACPA/NRMCA/PCA. Suggest sit down of all parties involved to see how ISCP can fit in and contribute; strategic plan (Mark Snyder suggested to develop MOU with all previous mentioned organizations).
 - Leif Wathne Need input from potential sponsors to shape what they want to see in member benefits. What benefits are organizational members deriving between conference years? Be careful that mission of ISCP does not infringe/overlap on ACPA such that the two don't compete with each other. Time to sit down and have a strategic planning session (last one in South Africa 10 years ago); suggest add to agenda for Pittsburgh.
 - Lori Tiefenthaler suggested lowering organizational membership sponsors. If companies are paying, keep it. If not, consider reducing.
 - Mark Snyder Webinar series has been added so perhaps the additional costs for organizational membership is now warranted.



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- Dan Zollinger (online) suggested ISCP and ACPA sit down and compare what gap ISCP can fill in the industry that ACPA does not currently do.
- Principal difference is international tech transfer that ISCP does. Also, more research base in ISCP whereas ACPA more industry based.
- o Idea of webinars is to get people thinking forward on new topics.
- Theoretical workshop before Berlin conference want to know if ISCP wants to cosponsor.
 - o No objections. Leif Wathne and Mark Snyder expressed interest.
